SOME NOTES FROM GRETEL DUNSING'S YEAR--On the 2nd of July Fred Enholm brought me to the Lighted Lantern on Lookout Mountain where I would be on the staff for the annual Folk Dance Camp, teaching a recorder group and German and Austrian Folk Dances, helping with the plans for the "Bavarian Holiday." Until the start of camp on the 7th I aided with preparations, had much time to myself, lovely dinners at the Kermiets, a few trips thru the lovely mountains when Paul and Pauline went on errands. Camp was great. The location is superb, high above Denver with a gorgeous view of the city, hazy during the hot days, beautifully clear at night with the city's lights shimmering and twinkling. Camp was filled to capacity with wonderful folk dancers, food was always excellent and the spirit among dancers and the staff was one of cooperation, affection and love. Nelda Drury taught most beautiful dances to good music with superb teaching skills and her daughter Elizabeth Anne is delightfully impish and uninhibited, a good dancer and a warm, lovable person. Dick Oakes often helped me demonstrate dances with much appreciated gallantry; he is a spirited and good Kolo teacher and the idol of the young ones in camp; also of some of the "not so young ones." Rudi Ulibarri--as always--kept us laughing and entertained us and Jim Graham did a wonderful job of coordinating everything, being MC at the evening parties, leading singing and some dancing with his accordion. Paul and Pauling Kermiet and Fred and Mary Enholm gave good leadership in a variety of activities; so did the Kermiet young people. I enjoyed Mary's accompaniment when I played some recorder sonatas; she is a sensitive, fine pianist. And as always I enjoyed my relationship with all the fine young people who worked in the dining room and kitchen. They were a really fine group of youngsters, beards, long hair, and all. One day I visited with Vyts Beliajus in Denver. He looks very well.
