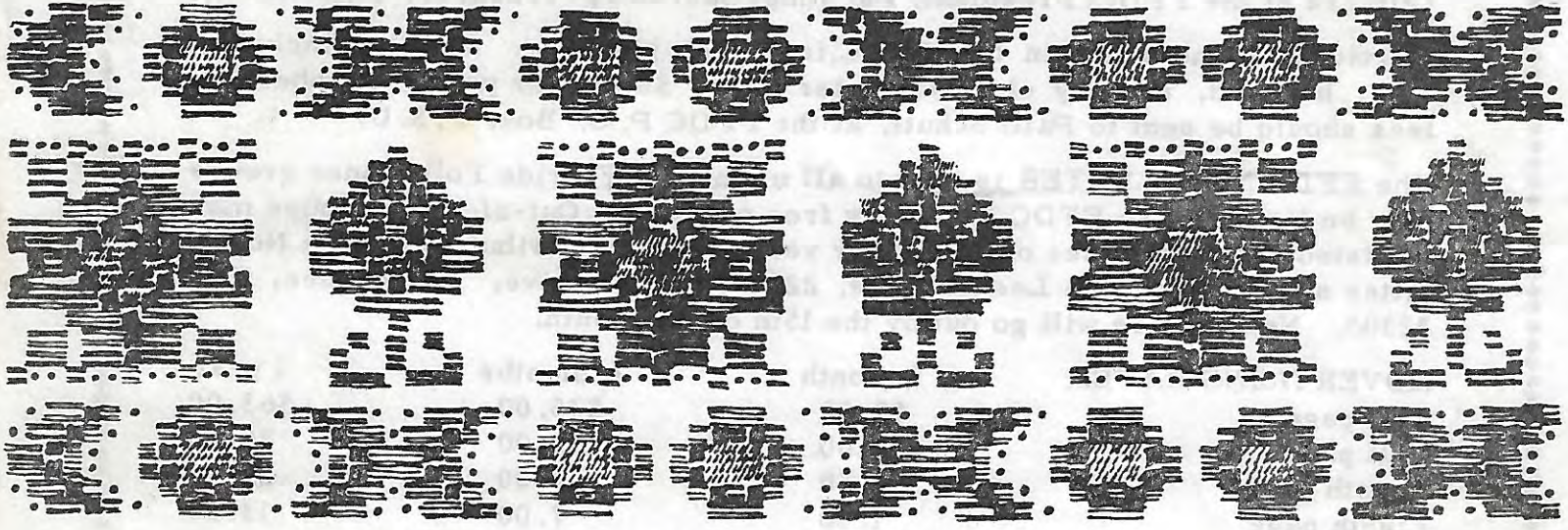

UPDATE ON THE FLORIDA FOLKDANCEFEST

The Folkdancefest is now less than a month away. The Tallahassee group is looking forward to the weekend with great "anticipation". For this years performance we have scheduled eighteen segments of International Dance. This year we will be welcoming two new groups to our festival in addition to those that have come in the past. The Greek Club at F. S. U. will be performing the Greek segment, and the other new group, the Hungarian Club from Daytona, will perform a Hungarian segment.

The remaining segments will be performed by the following groups:

Daytona Beach (not same as above) -- Romanian
Miami -- Israeli and Yemenite
Orlando -- Scandanavian and Croatian
Pensacola -- Bulgarian and Russian
Tallahassee -- Hungarian and Macedonian
Tallahassee (not same as above) -- Egyptian and Middle Eastern
Tampa -- Portugese and Mexican
Tampa (USF) -- Turkey and Bulgarian

We also have an added treat: Daemon Baizan and Drew Harris will provide live music for Tampa's Turkish segment.

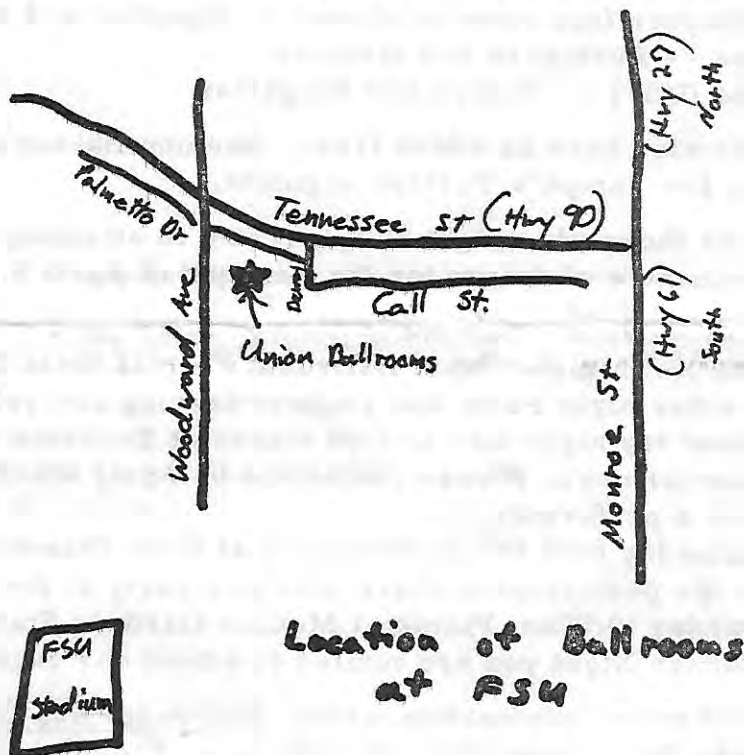
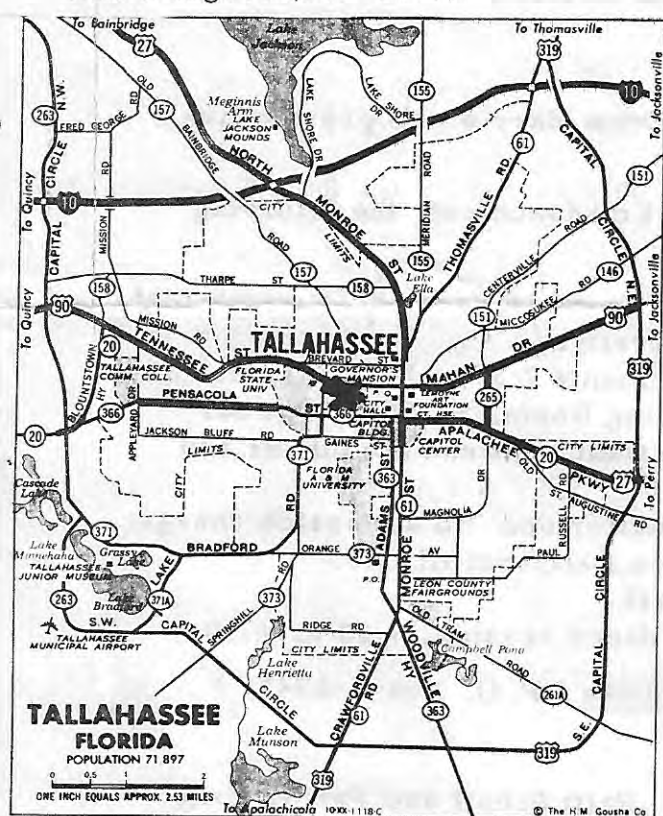
Every Sunday from 7:30 to 10:30 and every Thursday from 8:00 to 10:30 the folkdancers meet in the Union Ballrooms of Florida State University.

Teaching is from begining of class until 9:00. Thursdays are reserved for the harder dances. From 9:00 until the end is all request dancing. Anyone may attend on any night regardless of dancing expirence. We do not charge admission for participation.

The favorate dances are the couple dances of Poland and of Hungary. There is an effort to mix the type of dances up. About eighty percent of the dances done here are from the counries of Poland, Hungary, Romania, Bulgaria, and the ethnic groups of Yugoslavia.

Most of the dancers who come on a regular basis are between the ages of 22 to 28 and are no longer in school.

The Florida Folk Dance Council in concert with the Ormond Beach Recreation Dept. will present the highly noted Romanian folk dance authority, Mihai David, in a weekend workshop of Romanian dance and styling.

The new facility has a wood gymnasium floor, hot showers for men and women, full kitchen and dining facilities. It is conveniently located just north of SR 40 on Nova Road (SR 5A). From I-95, exit east at SR-40 (Tomoka Ave.), then north 1/2 mile, or one mile south of the junction of US-1 and SR-5A. Look for the sign to "THE TRAILS" on the west side of Nova Road. We have been asked to bring soft shoes for dancing; sneakers, casuals, opanki, gillies, or ballet slippers to avoid damaging the floor.

WORKSHOP SCHEDULE:

FRIDAY, 20 MAY, 7:30 - 12:00, Folk dance party - The program will be made up from the ten requests you submit with your registration.

SATURDAY, 21 MAY, morning (9-12) and afternoon (2-5). Teaching sessions on Romanian dances with Mihai.

Pot luck supper featuring Romanian dishes to be prepared by the Ormond Beach International Folk Dancers. (Out-of-towners might help by contributing items not requiring prior preparation.)

Dance Party, 7:30 - ?, Bring your costumes. Special program to be presented.

SUNDAY, 22 May, 9:00 - 12:30, Review Session of dances taught. A syllabus of dances presented will be available.

Sleeping bag space will be provided for out-of-towners if advance notice is given. Several motels giving the dancers special prices will be sent upon request and will be available at the dance. Please send your registration in early. It will be appreciated.

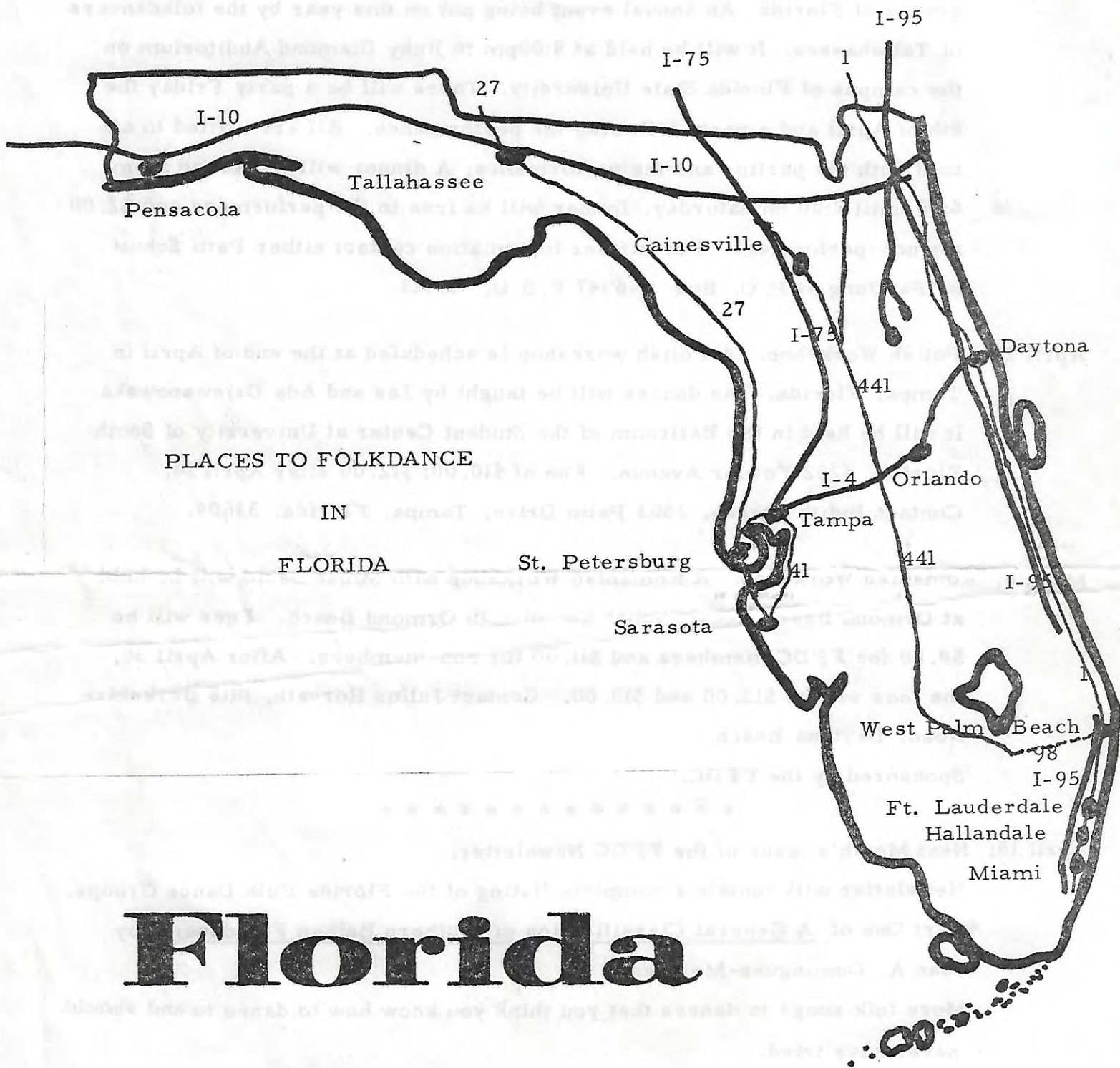
