JULIUS HORVATH HONORED

The Hungarian government has invited Julius Horvath to attend an expense paid workshop/seminar for advanced Hungarian Folk Dance leaders in Budapest this summer. Subjects will include dance styling and techniques, costumes, stage presence, choreography, and dance notation, all to be conducted in the Hungarian language.

Following the workshop, Julius will rehearse with a leading folk dance company for a performance to be presented at the International Folk Dance Festival to be held in August in Hungary. A two day picnic with live music following the performance will help the company to unwind before boarding a boat for a cruise on the Danube. They will repeat their performance at many of the small villages along the river banks to share with the people their native dances.

Julius will then travel to south-east Transylvania to study privately under a noted folk dance researcher and ethnologist. He will visit several remote villages where civilization has not yet corrupted the native dances. A truly outstanding opportunity and experience. He will be returning (if they let him out of the country) with a wealth of dance material, costumes and memories to share with all.

To all FFDC Groups and General Membership: from Fdfst 79 Director & FFDC President:

Folkdancefest 79 will be held at McKay Auditorium in Tampa, instead of Curtis Hixon, as previously announced. The change was necessitated by the Arts Council's inadvertent omission to confirm the Fdfst booking. The omission came to light when I made some other inquiries long in advance of actual need, so that there was still time to secure an alternative facility (a Dios gracias!) So take note--be an early bird (& watch out for professionals who occasionally goof up too!).

McKay Auditorium is part of the University of Tampa, which is on the north side of Kennedy (Hwy 60) just west of the Hillsborough River. The stage is 28' wide and at least 30' deep. It seats about 1800 and is used for many local cultural events.

Although I continue to hold it possible for more than one group to represent a single nationality at Folkdancefest, I feel that it should be official FFDC policy that ethnic groups which are invited to participate, or which are members of FFDC and present acceptable material, should not be placed in competition with International Folk Dance groups representing dances of the ethnic group's nationality (except in the case of this being specifically sought, urged, and supported by the ethnic group in question). That there could be a problem perhaps only became obvious because of the proposal procedure of selecting acts for Fdfst. At any rate, I have felt such a guideline to be necessary, and in adhering to it out of a concern for cultural heritage sensibilities in the face of our International Folk Dancer "take over" attitude, have not accepted any International Folk Dance group proposals for dances of a nationality which was represented by an acceptable proposal from an ethnic group.

MINUTES OF THE FFDC MEETING

The meeting of the Florida Folk Dance Council was held on February 17, 1979 at the Martin Koenig Workshop in Gainesville.

The meeting was called to order by Judith Baizan, President. Judith recommended that any group sponsoring a workshop should print the cancellation policy on the flyer. It was also suggested that this policy be as liberal as possible, allowing full (or at least partial) refund up until the date of the workshop.

Judith mentioned that the number of people attending workshops has been down.

The camp situation for FFDC workshops was discussed. Scholarships for a lead to a possible camp site were noted - the guidelines can be flexible. Pat Bridgham recommended checking into tennis camps. Judith is looking into Howie in the Hills. The camp Julius Horvath had suggested was looked at by Judith but does not meet our needs.

Judith discussed Folkdance Fest and recommended that the last weekend in April be considered for 1980 and all future dates. Problems of funding FDF were discussed. Judith proposed having a workshop at that same weekend. John Daly suggested having a dance festival (a workshop without a teacher). Any further suggestions should be sent to Judith. She will meet with the St. Petersburg International Folk Festival Society. This year FDF has been changed to McKay Auditorium.

Future meetings of FFDC will be held at workshops when necessary.

As there was no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

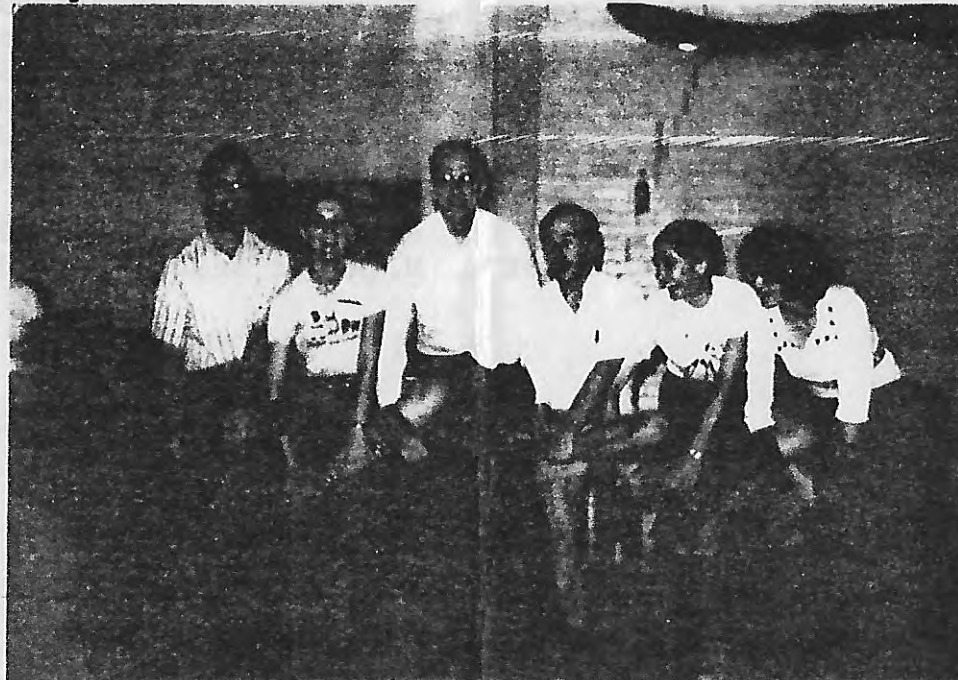

Accordingly we are enclosing a contract setting forth the provisions of the tour in detail, in accordance with your offer.

Remittance of all fees is enclosed. The degree of our commitment to this tour is shown by the effort which we were compelled to put into obtaining the remittance in the obscure currency which you have specified.

Please note that we will require sleeping bag space for thirty (30), payment for which is enclosed. Please note that this refers to thirty people of male and female and mixed and opposite sexes. By mutual and unanimous motion and emotion be advised that separate spaces are not required.

In response to your request for assistance, we are providing suggested menus and dance syllabi for your consideration.

We are pleased to assure you that we are able, through the efforts of our secretary, to provide dance shoes which will not damage the delicate nature of the dance floor.

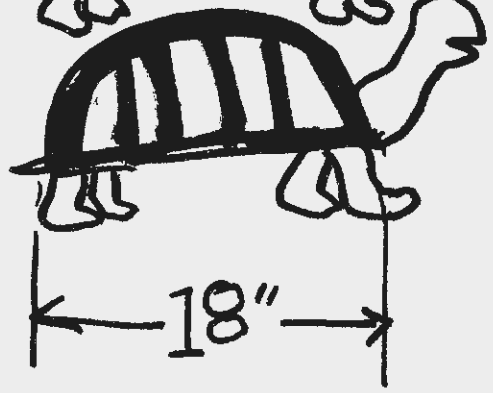
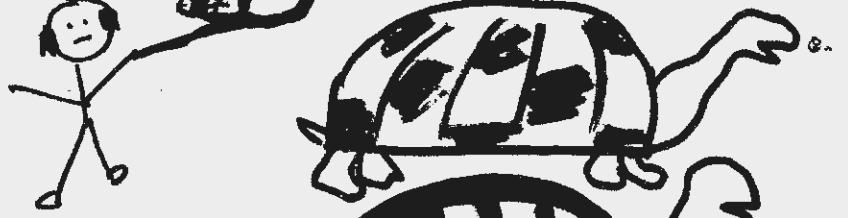
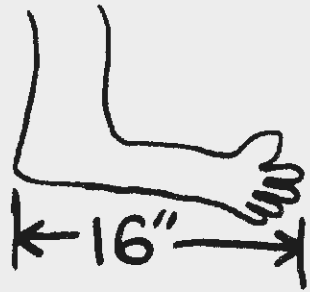

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT BETWEEN EARL GALITZ AND THE
FLORIDA FOLKDANCERS

This memorandum witnesseth the agreement between Earl Galitz, instigator, and the members of the Gainesville Folkdance Club, hereafter known as the marks.

WHEREAS the instigator is desirous of placing his name and countenance on the folkdance map, and

WHEREAS all possible areas of the world where interesting dances are done have already been exploited by other folk dance leaders, and

WHEREAS the marks will travel to any length and go to any expense to expose themselves to some new obscure dances (not to mention other things)

Be it therefore agreed that

1. The instigator agrees to provide a folk dance tour of the Dry Tortugas. Said tour will never leave Miami. And if said tour does leave, it will never return.
2. The instigator agrees to provide transportation to the Dry Tortugas via collier ship through the scenic Bermuda Triangle.
3. The instigator agrees to provide transportation on the Dry Tortugas via Tortugas Tortoise and/or Sopwith Camel.
4. The instigator agrees to provide a dance floor of granulated silicone dioxide, with shells provided wherever the syllabus requires a stomp.
5. The instigator agrees to provide sleeping bag space in an area scenically provided with interesting native fauna.
6. The marks agree to provide an opening fanfare performed by Illeya.
7. The marks agree to pay to the instigator a totally unreasonable sum of money, receipt of which is disdainfully acknowledged by the instigator, payable in non-existent currency.

Now, therefore, and wherefore, in consideration of the premises and other domiciles, the parties agree to party until all parties are worn out and can bear only to plan the next party.

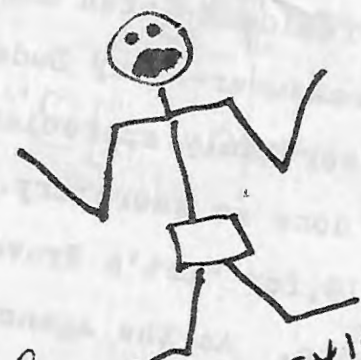

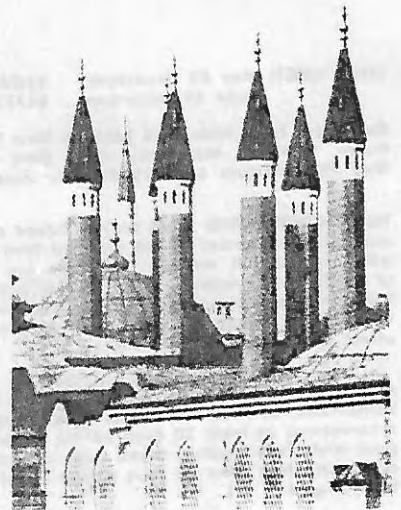

TOUR COST: May 29 Departure \$1650.00
June 19 Departure \$1775.00

Rates are from New York back to New York based on sharing twin room. If single occupancy room then costs will be \$1788.00 for May 29 departure and \$1913.00 for June 19 departure.

TOUR COST BASIS: Land tour is based on a number of 15 participants. If this number is not reached then the tours will be cancelled with full deposit refunds. All costs are based on the current rate of exchange between the U.S. Dollar and the currency of the countries in the itineraries. Any change in the exchange rate may change the selling price of tour. Air fares are based on rates in effect on September 15, 1978.

AIR TRANSPORTATION: IS BASED ON THE 14/45 DAY ADVANCE PURCHASE EXCURSION FARE (APEX) requires that you make your reservations at least 30 days before departure. Tickets must be fully paid and issued within seven days of confirmation of all segments, but, never less than 30 days before departure. Reservations may not be changed.
